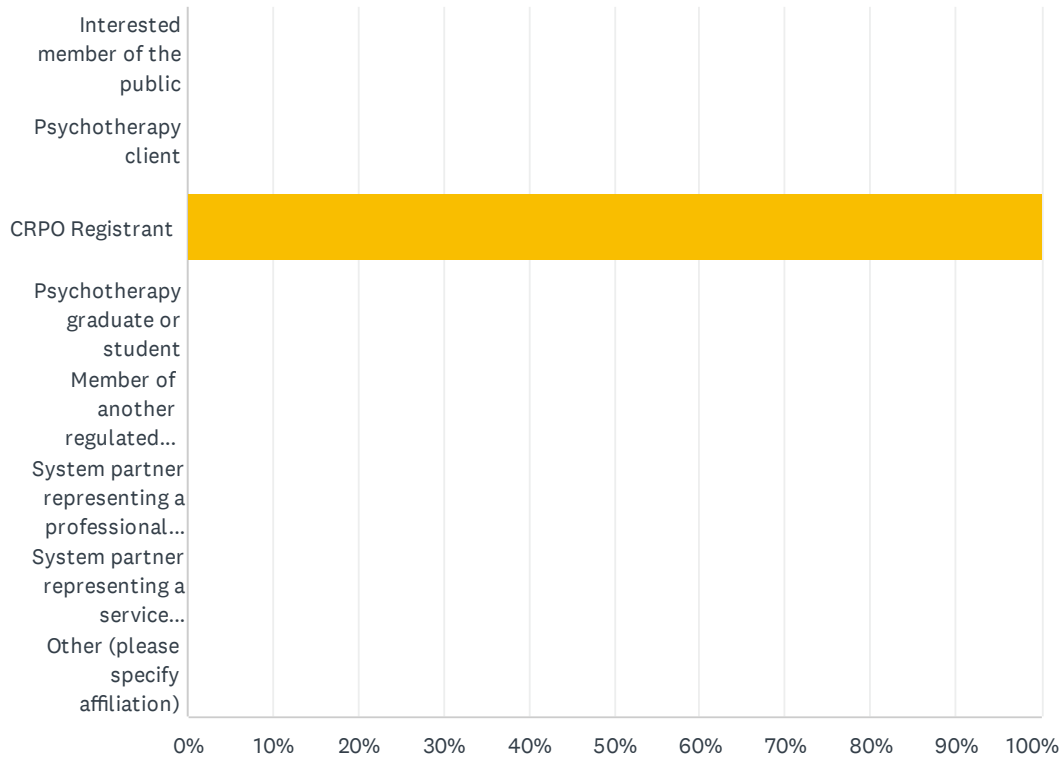

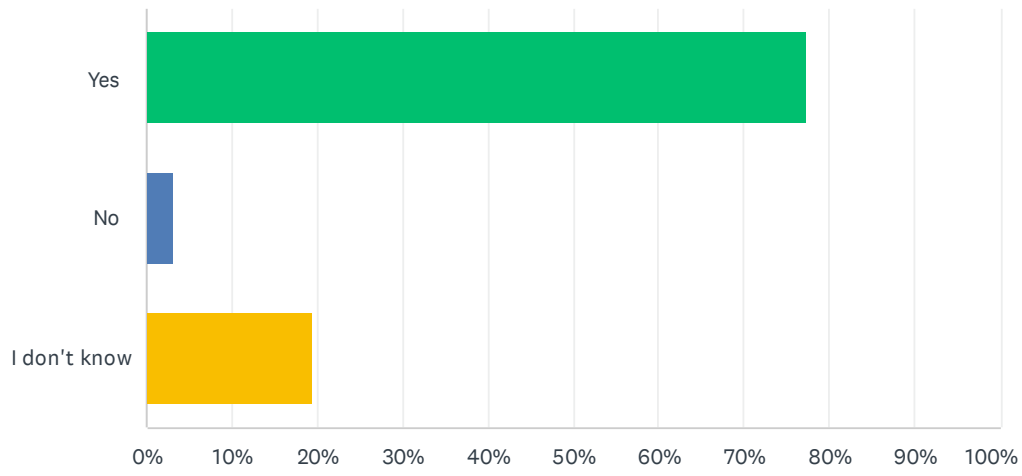

8	Under section 1.01, since all RPs have completed an initial registration and is required to qualify for further levels in qualifying, enhancing and maintaining our credential, can there be an implementation of other distinctions with RP membership instead of registrant. RP-Qualifying (RP-Q), RP-Intern (RP-I), RP-Fellow (RP-F) and for students who have not been registered and may be pursuing hours to qualify for registration (CRPO-Student CRPO-S). Some clients have misconstrued the letter Q as an indicator of practitioners' level of expertise and experience.
